WHAT IS V.S.M.A.?

In November, 1935, a general meeting of the Old Students' Association of the University Conservatorium discussed the subject of Music in Schools and various ways and means of raising the standard. For the next two years various sub-committee meetings were held to formulate plans for putting these ideas into practice.

This led to the establishment in November, 1937, of the Council of Music in Schools, consisting of representatives of the University of Melbourne, the Education Department, the Incorporated Association of Registered Teachers, the Catholic Education Department and the Australian Broadcasting Commission. This Council acted until 1940, when an Association was formed of practising teachers of school music, with its own executive committee, to which four members of the C.M.S. were to be elected each year. This was the origin of the Victorian School Music Association, whose ideal is that music should be an integral part of everyday life in every school, and that its experiences can, and should be, shared in some way by every member of that school.

With this end in view, the V.S.M.A. has organised activities in which Public, Private, State and Catholic Schools have all united.

Senior and Junior Music Festivals are held in alternate years and the enjoyment derived by those taking part has been of immense value. These festivals embrace both city and country schools and thousands of students take part. In addition, each year a Chamber Music evening and a Combined Orchestral Evening is held to the benefit of all concerned.

In 1944, the Junior Symphony Orchestra was founded. This Orchestra is made up of students under the age of 21 years and from time to time gives concerts in city and country.

For its members the Association arranges lectures and conferences which will benefit them in their teaching.

The V.S.M.A. has many hopes and plans for the future and any financial surpluses are used to further the Association's aims, and to assist any deserving students in furthering their studies. Any contributions towards the work of the Association will be gratefully received.
