In the previous edition, NEWS featured a brief outline of the situation of the Ruhr, with regard to Germany. Last week it dealt with the problems of the Allied occupation, reparations, and some of the disagreeable heat between the Allies over the Ruhr. Perhaps the most deciding factor in the position of the Ruhr, has been one of hostility, particularly since the Ruhr statute came into operation. The German people object to the way in which the Allies have neither offered nor given Germany any control over the Ruhr.

The German attitude is to a certain extent justified as the Ruhr is essentially German territory without which full recovery would be impossible. But Allied countries suffered extensive damage as a result of Nazi-German aggression, and cannot afford to risk military revival in Germany. The Russian bitterness towards the Ruhr, followed by anti-west propaganda has fomented German strikes, strikes, deliberate disobedience of Allied orders. This has created further problems with the Ruhr, reaching affects on the Ruhr, Germany and the world.

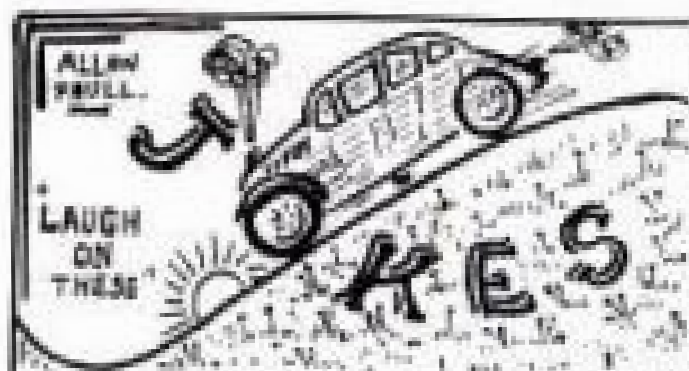

LANGUAGES IN SCHOOLS

THE RUHR AND GERMANY

FOR THE SECOND TIME IN THIS CENTURY A WORLD WAR HAS BEEN BROUGHT TO A CONCLUSION AND FOR THE SECOND TIME GERMANY HAS SUFFERED DEFEAT, BUT NEVER BEFORE HAS GERMANY HAD ITS ENTIRE TERRITORY OCCUPIED BY HER CONQUERORS IN THE FORM OF FOUR OCCUPATION ZONES GOVERNED BY THE MILITARY COMMANDERS OF THE BRITISH, AMERICAN, SOVIET AND FRENCH ARMIES IN GERMANY.

ALL FOUR ZONES ARE NOT EQUAL IN INDUSTRIALIZATION, AN IMPORTANT FACT CONSIDERING THAT GERMANY DERIVED ITS PROSPERITY ALMOST ENTIRELY FROM INDUSTRY; THIS FACT HAS ADDED TO THE FRICTION BETWEEN THE ZONES OVER THE QUESTION OF REPARATIONS.

THE AMERICAN AND SOVIET ZONES, BEING PREDOMINATELY AGRICULTURAL, ARE OF LITTLE VALUE FOR THE PAYMENT OF REPARATIONS, THIS MAKING THE HEAVILY INDUSTRIALIZED BRITISH ZONE, THE MAIN AREA FOR PAYMENT OF REPARATION. FROM THIS POSITION WE COME UP AGAINST THE PROBLEM OF THE RUHR.— THAT COVETED

TERRITORY, WHICH, EVER SINCE THE FRANCO-PRUSSIAN WAR OF 1871 HAS BEEN THE BACK BONE, INDEED, THE VERY LIFE-BLOOD OF GERMAN INDUSTRIES AND HAS BEEN UNFORTUNATELY THE ARSENAL OF GERMAN MILITARY MIGHT UNDER THE KAISER AND HITLER. IF GERMANY'S PROBLEMS ARE TO BE SOLVED, THEN THE PROBLEM OF THE RUHR MUST FIRST BE SOLVED. THE OUTLOOK IS EXTREMELY BLACK AS FAR AS SOLVING THE PROBLEM OF THE RUHR IS CONCERNED. THE SOVIET IS EXTREMELY DISSATISFIED WITH THE RUHR ADMINISTRATION ON THE GROUNDS THAT ALTHOUGH THE SOVIET UNION IS ONE OF THE FOUR OCCUPATION AUTHORITIES, IT HAS NO SAY IN THE RUHR.

CONTINUED NEXT ISSUE

FOR SOME TIME NOW PUPILS AND POSSIBLY TEACHERS TOO, HAVE BEEN BESET WITH PROBLEMS CONCERNING THE TEACHING OF LANGUAGES IN SCHOOLS. GENERALLY IT IS ONLY A SMALL MINORITY THAT IS ABLE TO CLAIM A HIGH DEGREE OF SUCCESS AT A LANGUAGE IN ANY CLASS. AT LEAST, WITH SOME RESERVATIONS, THIS CAN BE SAID OF CAMBERWELL HIGH SCHOOL. MANY REASONS HAVE BEEN

ADVANCED TO EXPLAIN THE INABILITY OF THE VAST MAJORITY OF AUSTRALIANS TO SPEAK OR EVEN UNDERSTAND A FOREIGN LANGUAGE OR LANGUAGES.

THERE IS A GREAT DEAL OF LOGIC IN MOST REASONS ADVANCED, ESPECIALLY FROM THE GEOGRAPHICAL POINT OF VIEW, SOME OF WHICH ARE— AUSTRALIA BEING AN ISLAND AND CONSEQUENTLY HAVING NO DIRECT CONTACT WITH PEOPLE OF OTHER LANDS, ELIMINATES THE NECESSITY OF KNOWING OTHER LANGUAGES AS FOR EXAMPLE THE SWISS PEOPLE HAVE ETC.

(i) IMMIGRATION OF FOREIGN NATIONALS INTO AUSTRALIA HAS NOT BEEN UNDERTAKEN ON A GRAND SCALE THIS MAKING AUSTRALIA OF FOREIGN ORIGIN A MINORITY WHICH IS FAR MORE LIKELY TO ADOPT ENGLISH AS ITS LANGUAGE RATHER THAN PERSISTING TO THE USE OF OLD LANGUAGES

(ii) A GREAT NUMBER OF SCHOOL CHILDREN CANNOT SEE ANY USE FOR A FOREIGN LANGUAGE IN THEIR FUTURE OCCUPATIONS AND DO NOT TAKE THE SAME INTEREST IN THE LEARNING OF A LANGUAGE AS WITH OTHER SUBJECTS. (SUCH AS FRENCH COMPARED WITH CRAFT).

(iii) MANY TEACHERS OF LANGUAGES IN AUSTRALIA, NOT OF THE NATIONALITY OF THE LANGUAGE THEY TEACH WOULD HAVE GREAT DIFFICULTY IN ATTAINING THE CORRECT ACCENT, CONSEQUENTLY THE PUPILS WOULD SPEAK "AUSTRALIAN" FRENCH, GERMAN, ITALIAN ETC. (I.E. A FOREIGN LANGUAGE SPOKEN WITH AN ENGLISH ACCENT) THIS WOULD NOT HAMPER THE LEARNING OF VOCABULARY AND GRAMMAR, BUT WOULD LEAVE THE PUPIL INCAPABLE OF CONVERSING IN THE LANGUAGE BEING SPOKEN OR STUDIED, WITH A PERSON OF THAT NATIONALITY.

THESE DIFFICULTIES APPLY MAINLY TO FRENCH, BUT A SUGGESTION TOWARDS A PARTIAL SOLUTION OF THE DIFFICULTIES OF LEARNING FRENCH WOULD BE, THAT PUPILS BE TAUGHT FRENCH IN THE FIRST YEAR AT HIGH SCHOOL AS IT IS DONE AT MARLBOROUGH HIGH SCHOOL (AND POSSIBLY OTHER COUNTRY HIGH SCHOOLS) THIS ENABLING PUPILS TO GRADUALLY GET INTO THE WAY OF UNDERSTANDING AND SPEAKING FRENCH.

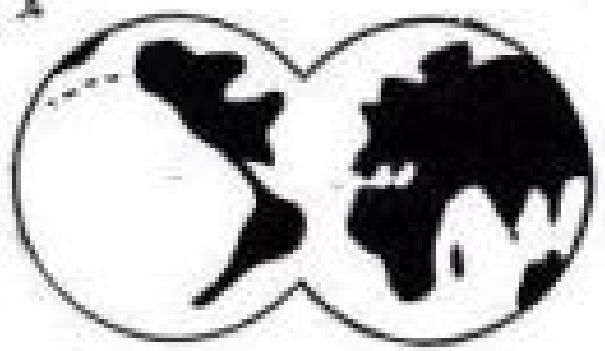

AN ACCOMPLISHED FACT

ISRAEL - AN ACCOMPLISHED FACT. THIS IS THE WAY THE WORLD NOW SPEAKS OF ITS YOUNGEST NATION, YET LESS THAN TWELVE MONTHS AGO THE JEWISH STATE OF ISRAEL WAS FIGHTING FOR ITS LIFE AGAINST THE INVADING ARMIES OF ARAB AND LATER SO HOSTILE ARAB STATES. OLD COUNTRIES OF MILLIONS OF PEOPLE HURLING THEMSELVES AGAINST A NEWLY-BORN STATE OF A FEW SCORE THOUSAND PEOPLE - THE MIGHTY GOLIATH AGAINST DAVID WITH HIS BRONZE SLING. TO THE MOST PESSIMISTIC ISRAEL WAS AN HISTORIC SLANDER, TO BE WAQUISHED AND FORGOTTEN, A RASH DECISION OF B.N.O. BUREAUCRATS FOR WHICH THIS GREAT INSTITUTION WAS TO BE HUMILIATED BEFORE THE WORLD, BUT ISRAEL SURVIVED; ITS PEOPLE, BORN OF A HOSTILE WORLD, FORGED INTO THE TABLET OF HISTORY, THE GLORIOUS EPIC OF THE WARSAW GHETTO, THE UNDESCRIBABLE HUMAN FORTITUDE OF THEIR NUMBER WHO LIVED AND DIED WITHIN THE CONFINES OF THE CONCENTRATION CAMPS, HOPE AND TRYING TO LIVE LONG ENOUGH TO SEE ISRAEL REBORN. IT WAS THOSE SURVIVORS OF ANTI-SEMITIC NAZIDOM WHO FUGHT THE ARAB HORDES. NO JEWISH SUPERIORITY IN ARMS AND EQUIPMENT DEFATED ISRAEL'S DEFEATERS. ISRAEL TRIUMPHED OVER THE ARAB HORDES OF THE JEWISH PEOPLE, IT WAS THE TERRIFIC COURAGE AND SUPERB MORALE OF THE JEWISH PEOPLE WHICH TRIUMPHED OVER THE ARMED MIGHT OF THEIR MERCENARY ARAB ADVERSARIES. THIS TRIUMPH OF ISRAEL AND STRAITS FOR AN ASSURING VICTORY FOR INTERNATIONAL UNITY IN A WORLD WHICH KNOWS AND SEES THE LITTLE OF THEIR QUALITY, WITHIN THE JEWISH STATE WILL DEVELOP A NEW WAY OF LIFE UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF ITS FIRST ELECTED PARLIAMENT. A NEW GENERATION WILL GROW UP IN THE ATMOSPHERE OF A SOCIETY FREE OF THE BRUTAL PAIN OF ANTI-SEMITIC HATRED, A GENERATION WHICH WILL PROVE WORTHY OF THE CENTURIES OLD STRUGGLE OF THE FORE-FATHERS FOR A JEWISH STATE.

AT LAST THE POPULAR ACTIVITIES CLUBS HAVE RECOMMENCED FOR 1949, THOUGH UNFORTUNATELY, IT CAN NOT BE SAID THAT ALL PUPILS ARE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE. IT IS INDEED A GREAT PITY THAT SOME FOREIGN STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO GIVE THAT LITTLE EXTRA VITALITY TO THE VARIOUS ACTIVITIES WHICH KEPT THEM AT A VERY HIGH STANDARD OVER THE PAST YEARS. THERE IS AN AMPLE VARIETY OF CLUBS THIS YEAR THROUGH THE CHESS AND DRAUGHTS CLUB WILL NOT BE CONTINUED. THE POPULAR CHOICE OF PUPILS SHOWED A PREFERRED TENDING TO ONE OR TWO CLUBS (NOTABLY THE PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB) LEAVING OTHERS WITH FEW MEMBERS. THE CURRENT AFFAIRS AND OPEN FORUM CLUBS SUFFERED AN DRAIVE UNDER POPULARITY TO SUCH AN EXTENT THAT AN REORGANISATION WAS NECESSARY. MR. ANDREWS FOUND IT NECESSARY TO INTERVENE AND IN AN AN EFFORT TO ACHIEVE A MORE EQUITABLE MEMBERSHIP IN THE CLUBS, ADVISED MEMBERS OF LARGE CLUBS TO JOIN SMALLER ONES. THIS MIGRATION WAS SLOW, BUT BY NOW ALL CLUBS HAVE A FAIRLY SUBSTANTIAL MEMBERSHIP AND ARE, APPROPRIATELY ENOUGH, HUMMING WITH ACTIVITY.
