## PRESIDENT'S REPORT JUNE 1994

The next CHESSES Vocational Breakfast for Year 12 students will take place in the School Hall at 7 a.m. on Thursday, July 28th. The theme this year will be "pathways to a Career", with a small number of speakers who will briefly address the students on their journey through academic and professional life, and take questions. The gathering will include breakfast, and a chance for students to meet volunteers from among the ex-student body who are also invited to attend and to be available for questions. Mr Peter Frost, the School's career advisor, is working with CHESSES to make this event happen and of use to the prospective school-leavers.

Our Committee met at Sofia's Pizza in Burke Road, Camberwell, in April for a brief Annual General Meeting. During dinner, office bearers were elected for 1994-95, and Mr Geoff Sinclair spoke to the meeting about developments and new directions for CHS.

One of those developments, the maintenance program budgetted for \$500,000, has now commenced, with repairs and painting now underway. This will immediately improve working conditions for both staff and students, with a consequent uplift in morale. The next step will be to confirm the start



of building work on the Sports Hall, now that funding arrangements are in place.

#### FINANCIAL REPORT:

CHESS continues to be in healthy financial shape with some \$5000 on current account or fixed term deposit, after recent outgoings for postage and the Year 12 reunion barbeque in March.

#### THE SCHOOL:

Apart from the developments reported above, Acting Assistant Principal Claire Bolster brought the Committee up to date at our June meeting on some other moves:

Swimming Pool: CHS is now confirmed as the operator of the swimming pool, and developing a management team to look after it.

Self-management: Under the government's new policies, the Acting Principal and his senior colleagues are now responsible for hiring teaching and other staff, and that change of direction is well under way.

Uniform: A thorough-going review of all aspects of the School Uniform is now getting under way, after re-affirmation of the basic belief that uniform is desirable and should be observed in the wearing. The task now is to devise a set of uniforms -- boys, girls, winter, summer and sport -- which are effective, attractive and appropriate to the last decade of the twentieth century and beyond.
