Visit to sister city

FOUR Camberwell High School students will get their chance at international diplomacy on a trip to China this week.

Year 10 students Sarah Cramby and Sara Foulds, from Ashburton, Naomi Davies, from Hawthorn, and James Puli, from Surrey Hills, will be in China to celebrate the 20th anniversary of Melbourne becoming a sister city to Tianjin.

They will join a delegation led by Melbourne Lord Mayor Peter Costigan travelling to Tianjin, the second most populated city in China.

Principal Elida Brereton and assist-

ant principal Ken Tenner will escort the students.

Ms Brereton said they would also be developing ties with a sister school, Tianjin Experimental School, regarded as the best in the city.

She said Camberwell High was chosen for the trip because of its excellent overseas exchange student program.

While in China they will visit the Great Wall of China and be part of the Channel Nine program *Postcards*, she said.

Included in the delegation are students from Wesley College and RMIT.
