### C.H.S. AWARDED 1.21 MILLION FOR NEW BUILDINGS

In a major vote of confidence in CHS the Department of Education has awarded the school 2.12 million to fund stage one of a new Arts and Technology complex.

The facilities will be constructed on the site of the old Central Pool complex, land given to CHS by the Minister [Mr Phil Gude] in January, 1998. More recently CHS has been fortunate to receive a further grant of \$90,000 from the Department of Education specifically for the purpose of clearing and redeveloping this site.

It is anticipated that the site redevelopment will begin this year, and that construction of the new Arts and Technology Complex will begin within 8 months.

*The school community wishes to thank our local M.P., Mr Phil Gude, for his continuing support of submissions from the School Council and the Principal Class from 1996 to the present day, and to publically recognise his work in endorsing CHS's need for a new complex.*

Currently all Art subjects taught at CHS are taught in general purpose portable classrooms, creating a less than ideal teaching environment,

whilst other subjects - Home Economics, Woodcraft, Metalcraft, etc., - are taught in inadequate spaces 'under' the old building or on the top level of the new building, with a similar net result.

These problems, and many others, will be addressed by the construction of the new, purpose built, complex.

Plans for the complex will be put on display at CHS for comments within the next few months.

### C.H.S NEWS in brief (cont.)

#### The Temple

This years' student production, "The Temple" by Australian playwright Louise Nowra, has been well received and was a credit to its participants and the school. A particularly demanding play in terms of characterisations and timing, it concerns itself with the corporate culture prevalent in the Australian financial scene in the 80's - greed, growth and collapse.

Public reaction was unequivocal; the play ran over four nights, with three sell outs and one near sell-out.

#### Tasmanian Music Tour

Several CHS band members and music teachers recently undertook a whirlwind tour of the Frozen Isle, performing at several schools and participating in a workshop at the University of Launceston.

Correspondence recieved by the school indicates that the CHS musicians were well regarded by their audiences for both their deportment and their music *"... the high standard of their performance gave their audience an appreciation of what is possible in the study and practice of Music, and what can be achieved through discipline and excellent tuition"* McKillop College, Tasmania.

#### Monash Legal Challenge

Legal studies students recently prosecuted a mock trial at the school. Judgment, handed down by Damian Ellwood, a CHS parent and barrister-at-large, found in favour of Jeremy Kennett, who will

now represent CHS at the inter-school level. It was noted that Lauren Beck's cross was also of a high quality, rendering final judgement extremely difficult.

#### 1999 SCHOOL OPEN NIGHT

Hundreds of visitors took advantage of the opportunity to tour our school, helping CHS to build community awareness of the nature, quality and breadth of courses on offer, and enabling the visitors to experience first hand the excellence of our students, their work, and our teachers.
