In a major vote of confidence in CHS the Department of Education has awarded the school 2.12 million to fund stage one of a new Arts and Technology complex.

The facilities will be constructed on the site of the old Central Pool complex, land given to CHS by the Minister [Mr Phil Gude] in January, 1998. More recently CHS has been fortunate to receive a further grant of \$90,000 from the Department of Education specifically for the purpose of clearing and redeveloping this site.

It is anticipated that the site redevelopment will begin this year, and that construction of the new Arts and Technology Complex will begin within 8 months.

# 10 GO TO ISOGO, JAPAN

8 students and two teachers recently returned from a 12 day cultural exchange visit to CHS's sister school in Isogo, Japan. During their visit the group stayed in both traditional Japanese "ryokan's" [inns] and enjoyed a homestay with their hosts.

### **Arts Festival Tuesday September 7th**

In a new approach, CHS will be incorporating the Chorals and Drama interhouse festivals into a single, mammoth, Arts Festival. The amalgamated festival will include drama, music, and art/Studio art, all of which will be presented and displayed for the evening in the Assembly Hall.

Currently all Art subjects taught at CHS are taught in general purpose portable classrooms, creating a less than ideal teaching environment,

> whilst other subjects - Home Economics, Woodcraft, Metalcraft, etc., - are taught in inadequate spaces 'under' the old building or on the top level of the new building, with a similar net result.

These problems, and many others, will be addressed by the construction of the new, purpose built, complex.

Plans for the complex will be put on display at CHS for comments within the next few months.

#### **The Temple**

This years' student production, "The Temple" by Australian playwright Louise Nowra, has been well received and was a credit to its participants and the school. A particularly demanding play in terms of characterisations and timing, it concerns itself with the corporate culture prevalent in the Australian financial scene in the 80's - greed, growth and collapse.

Public reaction was unequivocable; the play ran over four nights, with three sell outs and one near sell-out.

#### **Tasmanian Music Tour**

Several CHS band members and music teachers recently undertook a whirlwind tour of the Frozen Isle, performing at several schools and participating in a workshop at the University of Launceston.

Correspondence recieved by the school indicates that the CHS musicians were well regarded by their audiences for both their deportment and their music "... the high standard of their performance gave their audience an appreciation of what is possible in the study and practice of Music, and what can be achieved through discipline and excellent tuition" McKillop College, Tasmania.

Monash Legal Challenge
