
One of Yvonne's many CHESS legacies: Digital archiving of the school's history

An important initiative, for ex-students and current students, which Yvonne and her committees oversaw was the digital archiving of hundreds, if not thousands of items, including the school magazine Prospice, photographs and event booklets, dating all the way back to 1941. This digital archive provides perpetual and easy access to the school's history for all ex-students though the CHESS website. There were several people/ex-students, who volunteered many hours over a few years, to scan and collate the hardcopy originals to digital copies. The volunteers who supported the digital archiving include Chris Burford (class of 1965), Harvey Broadstock (class of 1965), Phillip Richardson (class of 1952), Chris Burford (class of 1965) and staff of Camberwell High School, where the original documents were stored for many decades.

Camberwell High School HISTORY

The CHESS Facebook page has been active for several years. The last few years have seen an increase in activity with the posting of many and varied stories with photographs and memories.

Camberwell and Boroondara are on the traditional land of the Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung people. One of the historically interesting posts highlighted a photograph of the school site, which we believe was photographed in the early 1930s, before any school building was erected. Based on various comments from many people on Facebook, the photograph seems to have been taken from somewhere near the current Camberwell Waste and Recycling Centre, looking north-east. You can see Riversdale Rd running from left to right in the foreground, behind the shrubs. The low-rise structure, centre-left, is the then newly constructed Camberwell Baths. The future school grounds, behind the baths, are criss-crossed with walking paths.

TRIBUTES

Barry Garnham - Inaugural President of CHESS 17/5/1933 - 31/3/2022 Class of 1949

Barry was in one of the first intakes (1945-1949) of students, attending Camberwell High School after the war. He completed his studies at Leaving (Year 11) level, as was the norm in those days. In his student days he was a Prefect, playing in both the senior football and cricket teams (*Prospice 1949*). During this time, he worked part-time at Allsops Nursery and the Camberwell Market. He reflected on time as his "University of Life" – learning how to deal with people and working hard.



Barry's first full time job was with the SEC (State Electricity Commission) where he noted that a number of senior staff had studied accountancy. He decided this could be a potential career path and took up studying accounting, attending night school part-time for five years, to gain his accountancy qualifications.

In 1950-1958 he worked in a series of businesses – administration, HR and accounting roles. He commenced his accountancy practice in 1958, aged 25, with a key milestone being a lucky break that won him a long-term client – the Presbyterian Ladies College. The accountancy practice was sold in 1984 to Danby Bland Provan, now Accru Melbourne (with whom the family continue to work). Barry's insatiable work ethic, forensic questioning and planning mind were appreciated by his clients, who trusted him in making important financial decisions.

He married Joan in 1965 and had four sons, Anthony, Michael, Nicholas and Matthew.

Barry was a passionate sportsman and enjoyed playing cricket, football, tennis, table tennis and later, bowls. He was a cricket player for Highfield Road Baptists, Hawthorn-East Melbourne, Camberwell and Glen Iris Cricket Clubs. He was also the Captain Coach of the Canterbury Presbyterian Football Club. Unfortunately, he damaged his knee which ended his football career.

Barry had a keen interest in politics and stood for pre-selection as a Liberal candidate against Jeff Kennett in 1975.

As well as raising four boys, managing his business commitments, he always had a focus on assisting the community. Over the years he had multiple roles (often in founding, chairing/participating in organisations or committees). A few notable roles are:

- Community Youth Support Scheme Treasurer (17 years)
- Camberwell Care and Counselling Services (Camcare) Inaugural President
- Camberwell High Ex-Students Society (CHESS) Foundation President
- Member of Hawthorn and Camberwell Rotary Clubs
- Canterbury Family Centre Chairman and Treasurer

Another proud moment for Barry was when his granddaughter, Jessica, became dux of Camberwell High School, a few years ago.

A venture led him to open the first hardware store in Balnarring, on the Mornington Peninsula, where he lived for a short time, in the family holiday home.

As his family transitioned to adulthood and he had more time on his hands, he connected to the family history and the running of furniture businesses in Bourke Street, Melbourne, and Glenferrie Road, Hawthorn, in the 1930's. The dream of a new Garnham Brothers furniture store was born. In 1997 an opportunity arose to purchase the Jardan furniture company. This became a new project and obsession for Barry and his sons Michael and Nicholas, who have been integral in the establishment and growth of this business over the last 25 years.

Barry had a vision for CHESS, and it was formed in 1991, with the assistance of the then principal of Camberwell High School, Ann Rusden. Barry was the Inaugural President of CHESS and took every opportunity to promote CHESS for ex-students to keep in touch with, and support future Camberwell High School students.

In his retirement, Barry and Joan relocated to Queensland. At the age of 73, Barry suffered a stroke. He returned to Melbourne in 2020, where he was a resident at Lynden Aged Care. Barry retained his passions for watching and chatting with his mates about his beloved Hawks, always with his faithful dog by his side – definitely "man's best friend".

Barry's motto through life was **Disco Consulere Aliis** – learning to be considerate of others.

Fred Roberts

17th June, 2022

Fred started the Canberra chapter of CHESS.

Referring to CHESS, Fred's daughter Mardi, who also served on the CHESS committee, said: "I know dad really enjoyed his connections to the group (exstudents) - he was very fond of his school."



Excerpt from Yvonne Giltinan's article from the CHESS Newsletter, November 2016, noting Fred Roberts and his CHESS links and activities:

Recently I had the privilege of spending time with two of our alumni groups. As part of celebrating the school's 75th year, I visited the Canberra chapter of CHESS. Allan Carter (class of '56) organised a delightful get-together over lunch at the National Museum with 11 other ex-students and their partners. The Canberra chapter of CHESS was started by Fred Roberts in 1993 and has continued to meet three or four times a year. From 1997 to 2000, Fred coordinated a program whereby an outstanding CHS Year 11 science student visited Canberra for two days of work experience. The original suggestion came from Professor Graeme Cox, of the John Curtin School of Medical Research (JCMR), who offered to pay for an annual guided visit to the JCSMR. Dr Rosemary Wright provided accommodation for the young guests and took them on 'doctors' rounds' at the Canberra Hospital. The idea was to give the young visitors some idea of the options open to them in pursuing a career in science. The program went for four years, but unfortunately ceased when Graeme Cox retired.

Some of the ex-students I met moved to Canberra, began new careers, and made the Territory their home while still maintaining family links in Melbourne. For others, their link to Camberwell High School has remained strong through their CHESS membership and a keen interest in school and alumni activities.

Kempson (Kem) MAYBERRY

26th June 2022, aged 82

John O'Hara's (6 Seat) memories of Kem:

Kem Mayberry was Stroke of <u>Camberwell High School's</u> 1st winning Head of River Regatta in 1958. His crew was coached by Mike Aikman. Kem was a very good Stroke and is remembered with much affection by fellow crew members.

Kem was Captain of Boats and Stroke of the First Eight in 1958, and it was our first win in the High Schools' Head of the River (HOR), which in those days was rowed on the Yarra River over the old Henley Course.



The notice (of Kem's passing) this morning brought back a lot of memories for me. Kem was a lovely bloke. Kem and Brian Maley were both 6th Formers (and Kem was a Prefect as well). I and 3 other rowers were 5th Formers as was the Coxswain, and there were two Fourth Formers.
